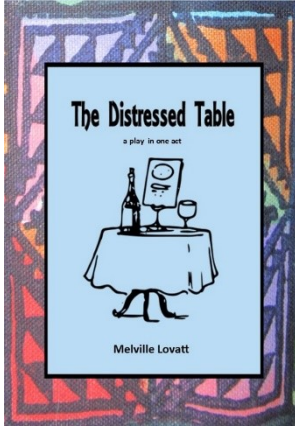

Two one-act plays *The Grave* and *The Kiss* were shortlisted for 'The Diane Raffle Award'. *Egg And Spoon* and *Making Adjustments* from his monologue collection, *Standing Alone*, won the 2018 NODA London Festival Performance Competition.

Melville studied playwriting at The City Literature Institute, Drury Lane, London and also at The Tricycle Theatre, Kilburn.

He is currently President of Harrow Writers Circle and lives in Hatch End, North West London.
