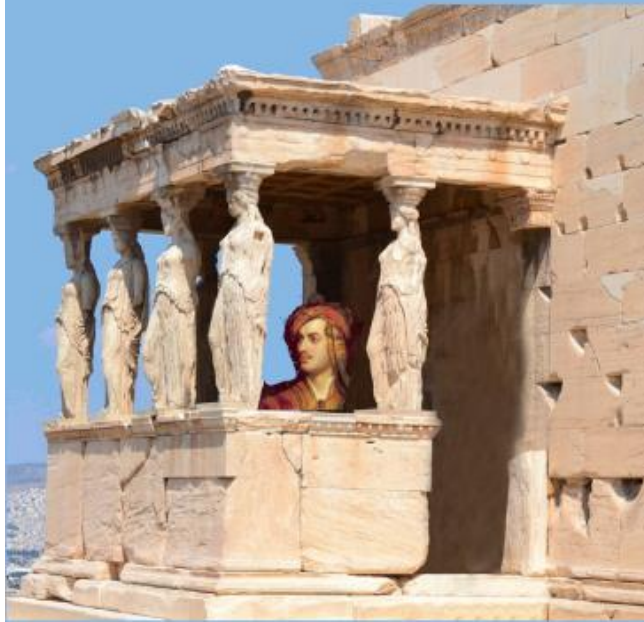


Thirty-Seven Guns
